JOINT RESOLUTION

Making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2007, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That this joint resolution may be cited as the "Revised
4 Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2007".

5 SEC. 2. The Continuing Appropriations Resolution,
6 2007 (Public Law 109-289, division B), as amended by
7 Public Laws 109-369 and 109-383, is amended to read
8 as follows:

1 “SEC. 115. Notwithstanding any other provision of
2 this division and notwithstanding section 601(a)(2) of the
3 Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 31), the
4 percentage adjustment scheduled to take effect under such
5 section for 2007 shall not take effect.

22 cation Activities’, \$671,224,000; ‘Cooperative State Re-
23 search, Education, and Extension Service, Extension Ac-
24 tivities’, \$450,252,000; ‘Animal and Plant Health Inspec-
25 tion Service, Salaries and Expenses’, \$841,970,000; ‘Agri-

1 cultural Marketing Service, Payments to States and Pos-
2 sessions', \$1,334,000; 'Grain Inspection, Packers and
3 Stockyards Administration, Salaries and Expenses',
4 \$37,564,000; 'Food Safety and Inspection Service',
5 \$886,982,000; and 'Farm Service Agency, Salaries and
6 Expenses', \$1,028,700,000.

7 "SEC. 20102. The amounts included under the head-
8 ing 'Cooperative State Research, Education, and Exten-
9 sion Service, Research and Education Activities' in the
10 Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Adminis-
11 tration, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2006
12 (Public Law 109-97) shall be applied to funds appro-
13 priated by this division as follows: by substituting
14 '\$322,597,000' for '\$178,757,000'; by substituting
15 '\$30,008,000' for '\$22,230,000'; by substituting 'for pay-
16 ments to eligible institutions (7 U.S.C. 3222),
17 \$40,680,000' for 'for payments to the 1890 land-grant
18 colleges, including Tuskegee University and West Virginia
19 State University (7 U.S.C. 3222), \$37,591,000'; by sub-
20 stituting '\$0' for '\$128,223,000'; by substituting 'competi-
21 tive grants for agricultural research on improved pest con-
22 trol' for 'special grants for agricultural research on im-
23 proved pest control'; by substituting '\$190,229,000' for
24 '\$183,000,000'; by substituting '\$1,544,000' for
25 '\$1,039,000'; by substituting 'competitive grants for the

13 "SEC. 20103. The amounts included under the head-
14 ing 'Cooperative State Research, Education, and Exten-
15 sion Service, Extension Activities' in the Agriculture,
16 Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and
17 Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2006 shall be ap-
18 plied to funds appropriated by this division as follows: by
19 substituting '\$285,565,000' for '\$275,730,000'; by sub-
20 stituting '\$3,321,000' for '\$3,273,000'; by substituting
21 '\$63,538,000' for '\$62,634,000'; by substituting 'at insti-
22 tutions eligible to receive funds under 7 U.S.C. 3221 and
23 3222, \$16,777,000' for 'at the 1890 land-grant colleges,
24 including Tuskegee University and West Virginia State
25 University, as authorized by section 1447 of Public Law

1 95-113 (7 U.S.C. 3222b), \$16,777,000'; by substituting
2 '\$3,000,000' for '\$1,196,000'; by substituting 'payments
3 for cooperative extension work by eligible institutions (7
4 U.S.C. 3221), \$35,205,000' for 'payments for cooperative
5 extension work by the colleges receiving the benefits of the
6 second Morrill Act (7 U.S.C. 321-326 and 328) and
7 Tuskegee University and West Virginia State University,
8 \$33,868,000'; and by substituting '\$6,922,000' for
9 '\$25,390,000'.

10 "SEC. 20104. Notwithstanding section 101, the level
11 for each of the following accounts for Conservation Pro-
12 grams of the Department of Agriculture shall be as fol-
13 lows: 'Natural Resources Conservation Service, Conserva-
14 tion Operations', \$759,124,000; and 'Natural Resources
15 Conservation Service, Watershed and Flood Prevention
16 Operations', \$0.

17 "SEC. 20105. Notwithstanding section 101, the level
18 for each of the following accounts for Rural Development
19 Programs of the Department of Agriculture shall be as
20 follows: 'Rural Development Salaries and Expenses',
21 \$160,349,000; 'Rural Business-Cooperative Service, Rural
22 Cooperative Development Grants', \$26,718,000; and
23 'Rural Utilities Service, Rural Telephone Bank Program
24 Account', \$0.
