House Subcommittee and Senate Full Committee Approve FY 2015 Agriculture Appropriations Bill

The House Agriculture Appropriations Subcommittee and the Senate Agriculture Appropriations Subcommittee and Full Committee met this week and approved the FY 2015 spending bill for USDA agencies, including the National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA). As shown below, all of the system's seven core funding priorities would be funded at or above their FY 2014 levels.
